# 2018 Summer Reading Program

More than 2.4 million students and children statewide participated in the 2018 Summer Reading Program, an increase of approximately 230,000 participants over last year's program, the New York State Education Department (NYSED) and State Library have announced. In addition, the NYSED announced results from its partnership with the myON e-book platform, which



from birth to 8th grade and their families last summer: 192,711 books were opened/browsed, 113,517 books were read, and 1,496,384 minutes of reading were logged within the myON platform.
