New Public Smoking Law and Libraries

In December 2018, Governor Cuomo signed S.169-B Rivera / A.330-B Dinowitz into law. This legislation amended Public Health Law §1399-0 by adding a new subdivision 6 to read:



6. Smoking shall not be permitted and no person shall smoke within one hundred feet of the entrances, exits or outdoor areas of any public or association library as defined in subdivision two of section two hundred fifty-three of the education law; provided, however, that the provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to smoking in a residence, or within the real property boundary lines of such residential real property.

"Smoking" is defined in Public Health Law §1399-n(8) as "burning of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, or any other matter or substance which contains tobacco." While companion sections of §1399-o include prohibitions against "vaping", defined as the use of an electronic cigarette, the new law does not contain such language. Looking forward, it is reasonable to assume that the new law will eventually be expanded to include the same vaping restrictions found in the article's companion sections.

The New York Library Association (NYLA) website includes informal information for library directors and trustees as they contemplate the measures required to comply with New York's new prohibition on smoking on the grounds of such libraries, to take effect Wednesday, June 19.

CSLP's 2019 Teen Video Challenge


Looking for an easy program to share with your teens? The 2019 Teen Video Challenge (TVC) has been streamlined to help make participating in this contest easier than ever!

- Instead of state winners, there will be five national winners. Just have your teens submit a link to their video.
- The program will <u>accept submissions June 1-Aug 2, 2019</u> so that the program can be incorporated into summer programs (it's still a great opportunity to partner with schools with video production classes or clubs; students can produce the videos as a class project and submit them in June!).
- Videos will be limited to 60 seconds, making this a much more doable project for small teams.
- Permission and model release forms will only be required from the winning entries (completing the forms is a requirement to receive prizes and acknowledgement).
- The TVC Ad-Hoc Committee will convene a judging panel from Collaborative Summer Librry Program (CSLP) partners and members.
- Video uploads will not be limited to YouTube and Vimeo; rather, teens can upload to the social media outlet of their choice




