### NY State Legislative Session Wrap-Up

The Legislative Session wrapped up with excellent news for the State Aid for Library Construction Program; both houses approved a bill to restore the \$20 million that the Governor cut from the program. This should put the program back to its high-water mark of \$34 million, which was reached last year.

Legislative Grants-in-Aid Program: Discretionary funds assigned to the Senate and Assembly areas were awarded to libraries through the Grants-in-Aid or "Bullet Aid" program. Funds available this year were greatly reduced from prior years, with only \$5 million available to each the Senate and Assembly. Thirty-eight RCLS member libraries and one county organization will benefit from these funds this year:

### 2019 Twila Snead Award Presentation

Rebecca Gerald presented Lynn Miller and Sara Haynes (pictured below) of Sullivan County BOCES with the 2019 Twila Snead Commitment to Excellence Award at the Southeastern New York Library Resources Council (SENYLRC) Annual Meeting on June 7, 2019. This honor recognized their Cross-County Reading Challenge Program, and its goal: to get students enthusiastic about reading.

This simple, yet effective program works by asking students

to talk about books they read, and to enter those books into an online form. As of May 1, 2019, students in Sullivan County had read over 13,500



books. Looking at the data on popular genres and titles has also allowed librarians to gain insight into the reading habits of their students. Lynn Miller summarized the program as "a great way to encourage students to discuss books with others and create a culture of reading."

## Encouraging Readers at Barbershops and Laundromats

Christine Hauser writes, "At dozens of barbershops and laundromats across the US, the sound of children reading aloud mingles with the buzz and snip from barbers' tools or the din of washers. Makeshift shelves and crates hold books featuring cartoon characters, stories about pigeons, or the capers of superheroes. This developing movement, supported by nonprofit groups, entrepreneurs, libraries, and community fundraising, is redefining the borders of traditional neighborhood public libraries by creating literary spaces in places where children find themselves with time on their hands."



## Melvil Dewey's name Stripped From Top Library Award

Bright Katz writes, "Each year, the American Library Association awards the Melvil Dewey Medal to a recipient who has demonstrated "creative leadership of a high order" in such fields as classification and cataloging, library management and library training. It is the profession's top honor, named after the man who is widely regarded as the father of modern librarianship. But the council of the ALA has now voted to strip Dewey's name from the award, citing his history of racism, anti-Semitism and sexual harassment."

American Libraries Spotlight, June Michael Damron writes, "Louisville (Ohio) Public Library opened an innovative Sensory Space in August 2018 with the help of a \$50,000 LSTA grant. It offers teen sensory relaxation sessions, adult sensory exploration, sensory storytimes, and other activities for patrons on the autism spectrum. Louisville is one of the first public libraries to offer a free multisensory environment, which is housed in the library's Discovery Center. The space is divided into two sections to help tailor the experience to specific needs. One section is filled with tactile objects providing physical interaction; the other is a relaxation area."


